**ABSTRACT (250 words or less):**

The purpose of this grant is to provide TEC (Technology Enhanced Classroom, a variation of a SMART room) technology to one heavily used classroom auditorium in Griffin Hall, HLG 422. This technology will enable instructors in multiple disciplines to enhance students' classroom experience through the use of audio-visual aids like PowerPoint presentations, videos, and interactive online learning tools. Griffin 422 is housed in the Department of Modern Languages, which provides valuable General Education requirements to many different majors, but this room is also used by five different disciplines in two different colleges, Liberal Arts, and Engineering. In Fall 2016, 430 students from these various disciplines utilized Griffin 422, with projected enrollment substantially increasing as our student body grows.

## **Purpose of Grant:**

The purpose of this grant is to provide TEC technology (Technology Enhanced Classroom, a variation of a SMART room) to Griffin 422. A STEP grant would equip this room, which currently has no instructional technology, with a podium, computer, projector, screen, and speakers. This technology would allow instructors to enhance the classroom experience with audio-visual aids such as PowerPoint presentations, videos, music, and interactive online learning tools. Use of classroom technology will allow faculty to improve engagement with students, as well as prepare students for professional careers that increasingly require experience with audio-visual media. It is also crucial to upgrade these classrooms in order to better accommodate students with disabilities and varied learning needs.

Griffin 422 is housed in the Department of Modern Languages which serves hundreds of students every semester in several ways: as minors, majors, basic language requirements, and as part of other curriculums. However, this room is primarily used by several other departments including the departments of History, Geography, and Philosophy, Psychology, and Petroleum Engineering. The Department of Psychology teaches multiple sections of Psychology 110 in Griffin 422. This course is required for most majors on campus. Thus, many undergraduates from across the university in multiple disciplines will benefit from the addition of instructional technology in Griffin Hall 422.

In Fall 2016, six courses were scheduled in Griffin 422 servicing 430 students from multiple disciplines. A STEP grant would directly benefit students from all majors and colleges of the university who use these classrooms, while also helping to meet the objectives of the Universities Strategic Plan.
